Mortgage Fund: The entire amount you enter here goes to pay the mortgage. In the past this was called the Building Fund. None of this amount is donated to King of Kings benevolence †.

General Expenses: The amount you enter here pays for the regular expenses of the church, other than the mortgage. This includes salaries, utilities, ministry support, etc. We donate a percentage of this amount to King of Kings benevolence †.

Maintenance Endowment Fund: The entire amount you enter here is deposited into a separate account. The earnings from this fund will help to pay for any major maintenance expenses that are not covered by insurance. None of this amount is donated to benevolence †.

Special Offering: The entire amount you enter here is paid as you specify in the next line. Some examples are ELCA funds like International Disaster Response, large organizations like the Gideons, local organizations like Dawn Farms, and King of Kings needs like unpaid bills. None of this amount is donated to King of Kings benevolence †, unless that's what you specify.

Total Enclosed: If you entered an amount in more than one of the above lines, please total the amounts here and make sure this total matches the amount you enclose. If using a check, write the check for this total amount; don't write a check for each line.

Name: Please enter your name so that your offering is properly credited to you.

† King of Kings donates a percentage of all General Expense offerings to benevolence. Part goes to the ELCA for synod and church-wide activities. The rest goes to local benevolences as determined by the Social Outreach ministry. The percentage for 2007 is 14%. We try to increase this percentage every year.
